September Meeting

The Longwood bonsai show will be held earlier in October this year. Because of this, it was decided to change the date of the preview meeting to this month. Our topic is the same; those members who are displaying tree(s) will bring their tree(s) to the meeting so that the members can preview and enjoy the trees.

Directions to the Brandywine Town Center (BTC)

The meeting hall is a stand-alone building, removed from the commercial area, with a large glass dome on top.

From Route 202 Southbound: Shortly after crossing into Delaware on Route 202 southbound, turn left onto Naamans Road at the intersection bounded by an Exxon station and the Days Inn. At the second light, turn left into the Brandywine Town Center (You will see a large Target store), turn right, and follow the outer parking lot ring road to the meeting hall.

From I-95 Northbound and 202 Northbound: Take Exit 8 Concord Pike North. Just beyond Concord Mall at the Days Inn, turn right onto Naamans Road and follow the directions above.

From I-95 Southbound: Take the I-495 and Naamans Road exit just after passing into Delaware. Take Naamans Road westbound. After passing Grubb Road, you will take the next right into Brandywine Town Center. Look for the meeting center described above. The current duties of the BBS treasurer have evolved over time. Obviously whenever money is exchanged the treasurer is involved. There is online banking with Wells Fargo. The money originates from dues, raffles, silent auctions, the picnic auction (the biggie), and any other transactions.

Currently the treasurer pays bills, including presenters' fees, conducts raffles and itemizes and collects the payment at the picnic auction. The treasurer is also in charge of membership and has developed Excel spreadsheets to keep track electronically and has a backup of the paper registration forms. Name tags are produced by the treasurer. The group email distribution list is also maintained by the treasurer. The treasurer also maintains a relationship with the National Bonsai Foundation.

I have had a great deal of trouble keeping this species of tree alive. I have decided that they cannot tolerate the chlorine in my tap water. So I give it spring water.
