April Forest Meeting

Steve Ittel will lead the April meeting on forest/clump/group plantings. It will be held at Mark Huf's nursery (Directions Below). The first part of the meeting will critique a number of forest plantings by members. For those members who already have forest or clump plantings and would be willing to discuss them, please bring them along – particularly if they are easily transported. When the discussion portion of the meeting concludes, some of the newer members will participate in a planting workshop. Other members are welcome and encouraged to stay to observe and discuss the process. Please bring something for lunch because we will work into the afternoon.

Plastic trays suitable for forest plantings will be available at a discounted price, but you are also welcome to bring your own pot. Forest plantings can also be started in wooden boxes, particularly if you want to establish an unusual shape. For those of you who ultimately want your forest on a slab, it is generally best to get them started in a pot or box and then move them to a slab when the root systems have meshed together to form one continuous root mass. Drills will be available for making holes in plastic pots or wooden boxes to locate wires to tie down the trees. Club wire and other materials will be available. It would be best to bring your own soil but some will be available. Mark Huf will have a wide variety of plant materials available for sale for deciduous or coniferous forests.

Take Route 1 to Oxford, PA. Exit onto 472N. Take the first left onto Bethel Road. Stay on Bethel. Go right at the stop sign and then straight through the four-way stop. Take fourth driveway on the right. There is a big sign.

Review of Gabe Funke' Native Plants Talk

Thank you, Gabe, it was a very informative and interesting presentation.



Gabe started with a brief introduction of himself, explaining that he has been toying with native plants as bonsai for years.

He first acknowledged that Asian species are traditionally used for bonsai. With that he proceeded into a discussion of the pros and cons of numerous native plants. Plants he discussed were red maple, ironwood/musclewood, American beech, sweet gum, Osage orange, Pitch pine, Loblolly pine, Virginia pine, white oak group, willow oak, American elm, and some other promising species.
