This Month's Topic: Little Bonsai Trees (Rob King)

This month we will investigate the wonderful world of little trees. You may be asking why we are not calling them mame or shohin trees. There is no consensus on what height constitutes a mame or shohin tree. You can look at many bonsai books and magazines, or talk to bonsai artists, and you will find that the maximin height of a mame can be anywhere from $3^{\circ}-6^{\circ}$ and a shohin tree $8^{\circ}-12^{\circ}$. John Naka, one of our greatest bonsai artists, said in describing shohin trees that, "if I have a beautiful tree that is 11" tall, I am not going to cut an inch off the top so I can call it a shohin."

When I started practicing bonsai, I felt the need to classify my trees mame, shohin, etc. One of our founding members, who was known nation-wide for her mame and shohin such that she was known as "Mame Mama" asked me if the tree was more beautiful if I designated it as shohin or mame, was it worth more, and would people consider you a better artist if you said that you work on mame and shohin. When I said "No", she responded, "Then why take the time to measure your trees."

To start off our meeting, Tobin will introduce us to his collection of little trees. Next, Rob will describe some of the techniques used for creating little trees. While he is doing this, he will be using three small junipers for demonstration purposes. As Rob is working on one juniper, the other two will be circulating around the room. These three junipers will be raffled off at the end of the meeting.

Finally, we would love to see your little trees. Please bring some to share.

April Meeting: Our April meeting will focus on techniques for repotting your trees. George will open the meeting with a demonstration and then we will spend time repotting a tree or two. You will need to supply your own trees, tools,

and bonsai mix (Crown Custom Bonsai will have a supply of pre-made bonsai mix available).

Directions to the Brandywine Town Center (BTC)

The meeting hall is a stand-alone building, removed from the commercial area, with a large glass dome on top.

From Route 202 Southbound: Shortly after crossing into Delaware on Route 202 southbound, turn left onto Naamans Road at the intersection bounded by an Exxon station and the Days Inn. At the second light, turn left into the Brandywine Town Center (You will see a large Target store), turn right, and follow the outer parking lot ring road to the meeting hall.

From I-95 Northbound and 202 Northbound: Take Exit 8 Concord Pike North. Just beyond Concord Mall at the Days Inn, turn right onto Naamans Road and follow the directions above.

From I-95 Southbound: Take the I-495 and Naamans Road exit just after passing into Delaware. Take Naamans Road westbound. After passing Grubb Road, you will take the next right into Brandywine Town Center. Look for the meeting center described above.
