### **October Meeting**

Using similar junipers, we are going to break into groups of 3 to 4 people and each group will create a design for their tree. Once a design is agreed upon, the group will then carry out their design. There will be aluminum wire provided by the club and Rob. But each group will need to provide their own tools. Since you don't know which group you will be in, it will be a good idea to bring your tools in case nobody else does. At the end of the meeting, each group will give a description of their group's design.

A person from each group will be responsible for overwintering the group's tree and at a future meeting, each group will continue to work on the tree.

#### **October Give-Away**

We will be giving away Kunio Kobayashi's new book. It is written for both the beginner and those that are more experienced. It has pictures and photographs of the work as it is going along, and pictures of some of his greatest trees. ## **Directions to the Brandywine Town Center (BTC)**

The meeting hall is a stand-alone building, removed from the commercial area, with a large glass dome on top.

From Route 202 Southbound: Shortly after crossing into Delaware on Route 202 southbound, turn left onto Naamans Road at the intersection bounded by an Exxon station and the Days Inn. At the second light, turn left into the Brandywine Town Center (You will see a large Target store), turn right, and follow the outer parking lot ring road to the meeting hall.

From I-95 Northbound and 202 Northbound: Take Exit 8 Concord Pike North. Just beyond Concord Mall at the Days Inn, turn right onto Naamans Road and follow the directions above.

From I-95 Southbound: Take the I-495 and Naamans Road exit just after passing into Delaware. Take Naamans Road westbound. After passing Grubb Road, you will take the next right into Brandywine Town Center. Look for the meeting center described above. These directions and a detailed map are available all the time on the directions page of the BBS Website.

### A Tree That Promises Not to Die (Rob)

While at the Frederik J. Meijer Garden and Sculpture Park (see last month's newsletter), I wandered through the gift shop and while in there, I found the perfect bonsai tree. ## **US National Bonsai Show (Rob)**

In September, Bill Valavanis hosted the US National Bonsai Exhibit. This was a weekend of everything bonsai from international artists performing demonstrations, critiques, exhibition of some of the best trees in the U.S., auctions, and **vendors**. Vendors are highlighted because that is where I spent most of my time and money. When I say I mean I spent money; I mean spent money!!! I had a need for two specified bunjin pots and found them within

the first hour that the vendor area opened. At the end of the exhibition, I found that the vendor who was selling scrolls still had many of them unsold. After discussing these unsold scrolls with him and not being able to make up my mind about which one(s) I would purchase, I negotiated a great price, and I bit the bullet and bought all 11 that were unsold.









## **US National Bonsai Show (Karin)**

The show had the highest attendance I have ever seen and I have been to all but two. Sarah Rainer sold out of pots on the first day. The vendors were very popular. Especially some such as Suthin did quite a bit of business. Sean Smith lectured about suiseki and bonsai display. Corin Tomlinson (son of Harry) did a demo on a hinoki. The tree turned out so nice I wished I could have Corin work on mine. Two Pennsylvania Bonsai Society members won awards – Karen Harkaway for Best Native American Bonsai (Colorado Blue Spruce – by the way, I included a picture of this tree in a different pot in the July newsletter but mis-identified it as a eastern white cedar) and Lucas Glass for Best Deciduous Bonsai.

Crown Custom Bonsai (Rob): Rob will be selling his usual inventory of tools and wire. Currently, he had added bonsai pots from Japanese and China to his inventory. From the response he got from the pots that he brought to the September meeting, he will be importing more. However, from China/Japan it takes several months. Also, this month is the last time that you will see his inventory until January.
